Minutes

Welcome to Participants

Lorenzo Martellini from Pixel (IT) welcomes all the project partners to the online platform where the meeting took place.

Adoption of the agenda

Lorenzo Martellini from Pixel (IT) explains the meeting folder. The meeting agenda is introduced and adopted by all partners.

Partners' Presentation

Cristina Martins from IPB (PT) presents her institution. The Polytechnic Institute of Bragança (IPB, Portugal) asserts itself as an innovation co-creation ecosystem, involving students, teachers and staff with companies and organizations, aiming to create a regional knowledge-based economy and to implement strong international partnerships, both at EU and worldwide levels. IPB aims at being a reference in the European Higher Education Area, in the context of the universities of applied sciences system, implementing innovative teaching and practice-based research, through collaborative laboratories, strategic partnerships, and living labs, in a multidisciplinary and multicultural learning community.

Margarida Marques from AE Miguel Torga (PT) presented her Institution. Agrupamento de Escolas Miguel Torga (AEMT) is located in Bragança, an inland town, in the north of Portugal, with low population density and little diversity in terms of cultural offer. It was built in in the historical area and consists of 3 buildings: 2 in the town, 1 in the countryside. It is attended by 650 students, aged between 3 and 17, who learn English from the 1st year of primary school, French from year 5 and Spanish from year 7. There are 80 teachers with a permanent position working here together with 60 other who are in mobility due to own and family health problems. It is an inclusive institution that develops a culture of integration and humanism associated with the search for academic success in the different training offers: regular courses and Dance Course in association with the Conservatory of Music and Dance of Bragança.

Gisela Texeira from Centro Social Santa Clara (PT) presents her institution. The Social Center of Santa Clara is a Private Institution of Social Solidarity (PISS) under the tutelage of the Congregation of The Reparative Franciscan Servants of Jesus Sacramentates. The Institution integrates the social responses of Daycare – Preschool Education and Leisure Activity Center. It has cooperation agreement with the Institute of Social Security, IP, District Center of Bragança. Ministry of Social Solidarity of Portugal. The preschool education is under the tutelage of the Ministry of Education of Portugal. It is integrated in the social solidarity network of preschool education (Low 5/97).

Martina Lunardi from IC Bartolomeo Sestini (IT) presents her institution. Sestini Comprehensive Institute is a school dealing with education and training of pupils aged from 3 to 14 years. At strategic level, priorities of the school are outlined in the Three-Year Training Offer Plan (PTOF) and in the 2022/2025 Improvement Plan: the Sestini Comprehensive Institute aims to continue a progressive and gradual transition from a traditional and rigid teaching scheme to a more open, flexible, dynamic training system. The objective is matching the school system of didactic planning, based on innovative and collaborative approaches, with methods of high quality and training courses in full coherence with the Curriculum for Competences.

Alan Bruce from Universal Learning Systems (IE) presented his Institution. UNIVERSAL LEARNING SYSTEMS -





ULS - is an international consultancy firm specializing in research, education, training and project management. ULS undertakes projects for a number of clients in the educational, development and management sectors. It has a leading profile in EU distance learning and e-learning innovation networks. It has particular experience in project evaluation and quality assurance. It has developed an extensive range of e-learning courses and has experience of working with schools in developing enhanced engagement with teachers, communities and parents. UNIVERSAL LEARNING SYSTEMS has a core team of consultants plus a range of contract specialist staff. It works with several Irish kindergartens and with learners in a variety of educational settings: adult, VET, secondary and university. A key focus is training of trainers and teachers, diversity management and language learning expertise.

Andreea Ionel form EuroEd (RO) presents the Institution she represents. EuroEd Primary School includes a Kindergarten founded in 1995 and a primary school founded in 1997. Both are accredited by the Romanian Ministry of Education. It promotes the European dimension of education which has become part of the ethos and culture of the school. Therefore, it mainly encourages multiculturalism and multilingualism by providing education to children of different nationalities or belonging to different ethnic groups. Thus, even since the preschool age, by getting acquainted with cultural and linguistic diversity, the children acquire new skills which will help them to adapt to different contexts and situations. Without being a big school in terms of size (there are only 173 children in the school and about 100 in the kindergarten and 35 teachers) the institution boasts a very innovative methodological approach and is appreciated for its school ethos.

Elisabetta Delle Donne from Pixel (IT) presents the institution. Pixel was created in 1999, it is an education and training institution based in Florence (Italy). Pixel's mission is to promote an innovative approach to education, training and culture; this is done mostly by trying to exploit the best potential of ICT for education and training. Pixel training offer focuses on selected main areas: information and communication technologies, quality business management, language learning and European cooperation. The target groups of such activities are: schools, university, tourism organizations and public bodies.

Introduction to the project context and background Background

The motivation that backs up the "Early Years Digital Portfolio" EYDP project is related to the challenge felt by early childhood educators and kindergarten teachers in performing appropriate documentation and evaluation of the learning progresses in early childhood education and in cooperating with the families on the matter.

Early childhood educators and kindergarten teachers (see needs analysis) do not feel sufficiently prepared and motivated to provide appropriate visibility of the children's learning process to be shared with their families.

Aims

The "Early Years Digital Portfolio" EYDP project has the aim to create a more effective and transparent communication pattern among childhood education and care systems and families with the purpose to document, evaluate and assess the progress of each child according to a holistic view of the child's development and learning.

The project, therefore, intends to innovate and support the transformation of early childhood education institutions and the





qualification of their professionals, towards a more digital future of education.

Target Groups

The target groups of the project are identified as:

- Early childhood educators
- Kindergarten teachers
- Early childhood education institutions (kindergartens and nursery schools) through their managerial staff.

Activities and Results

The following activities will be implemented:

- Development of a digital handbook addressed to kindergarten educators providing them with the the
 pedagogical basis and framework for the construction of documentation processes of children's
 learning and performance.
- Creation of an online training package that will provide practical training on pedagogical documentation and assessment
- Production of a Digital Portfolio Management System (DPMS) for uploading digital documents related to children documentation and assessment

Work Package 1 - Management

Priorities

- Inclusion Dimension:
 - o Improving the outreach to people with fewer opportunities (disable people, rural areas, etc)
- Digital Dimension:
 - Digital technologies in education
- Environmental Dimension:
 - o Memorandum of understanding

Lorenzo Martellini from Pixel presented the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on environmental actions that will be taken by the partnership.

Quality Assurance
