Dr. Alan Bruce is Director of Universal Learning Systems. He is a sociologist who studied in Los Angeles, Galway, Amsterdam and Hull. He has lectured in universities in France, England and Ireland and worked in policy research for the European Commission in Brussels. In Ireland, he was responsible for national initiatives in professional development in the disability sector. He is Adjunct Professor in the Department of Rehabilitation Counseling with the University of Wisconsin-Stout and a member of the Graduate Faculty of the University of Memphis. He teaches for the National University of Ireland Galway on learning policy, diversity and systematic training. He has written and published extensively on innovative and applied learning supports. He was Senior Research Fellow with the University of Edinburgh with responsibility for educational social inclusion and innovative EU projects from 2009-14.

Dr. Bruce has lectured and published widely on the social impact of disability, labor market policy, innovative education, distance learning, social inclusion, conflict transformation, strategic change and managing diversity. He was elected Fellow of the European Distance and E-Learning Network in Naples in 2007 and Vice-President of EDEN in 2010. He has written policy and conducted research for Irish



government agencies with particular reference to community employment, best practice and labor market outcomes for marginalized groups. He has lectured and published widely on the social impact of disability, interculturalism, migration, labor market policy, innovative education, language learning, social inclusion, conflict transformation and managing diversity.

In 2018, he was appointed as External Expert for the European Commission in Brussels on migration policy and social inclusion. In 2018, he was appointed to the EU Commission's Steering Committee on Online Training for the European Workforce. He is an international academic adviser for the University of Memphis, and was appointed to its Graduate Faculty in the Department of Psychology and Counselling in 2014. He coordinated the Diploma in Professional Studies (Managing Diversity) operated by University College Cork and Waterford Crystal.

He is Assistant Professor with UOC, the Open University of Catalonia in Barcelona and teaches courses in international conflict resolution and peace-building. He was appointed as Learning Design Expert with Universidad Nacional de Educación (UNAE) in Ecuador in 2018.

Imelda Graham, M.Phil, has worked on national and transnational projects: including serving on the board of the European Training and Development Federation for a number of years, culminating in being elected as President. She has worked with the National After School Association in the USA, and presented at conferences in the USA, UK and Europe. Imelda is currently Chairperson of the *National Childhood Network* in Ireland. Previously Imelda served on the Board of the Irish Institute of Training and Development for many years.
